

YES FOR PEACE – Ink and paper revolution by the Filipino people against guns and bullets used in the name of the Filipino people.

BAYANIHAN NG BAYAN - Pro-active involvement and collective participation of the Filipino people in planning and budgeting for the integrated, convergent and holistic delivery of community-based government services.

"The successful realization of peace demands a holistic approach that will require the combined and integrated efforts of the civilian government, the military and the citizenry as a whole."





- Started as the DiYES FOR PEACE Bayanihan para sa Kapayapaan campaign.
  - In response to clamor of pupils from Gr IV to VI of Banga Elementary School, Plaridel, Bulacan.
  - Non-government initiated verifiably documented People's referendum for Peace based on Truth for Freedom eventually supported by the government.
  - Student / youth sector led initiative (APO, UP Inter-Fraternity Council).
  - Developed and pre-tested at the UP System from 16 December 1988 to 17 December 1992.
- Incorporated into the Education for All (EFA) by the Department of Education, Culture and Sports (DECS).
- Initially sought to declare all campuses of the UP System as a Zone of Peace, Freedom and Neutrality (ZOPFAN) with PhP10,000.00 seed fund from UNICEF through the UP-IFC.
  - Based on responses of its constituents students, faculty and administration.

- The UP Board of Regents unanimously adopted a resolution declaring all UP Campuses a ZOPFAN on 17 December 1992.
  - Upon motion of Student Regent Angelo Jimenez seconded by UP President Dr. Jose V. Abueva.
  - UP President Abueva offered UP as mediating institution and its campuses as venue for peace negotiations to PFVR.
- Adopted by the 7<sup>th</sup> Business Conference and the Board of Directors of the Philippine Postal Corporation (PhilPost) in August and September 1995, respectively, as their contribution to the comprehensive peace process in response to a call made by PFVR
  - Postmaster General Irineo V. Intia, Jr. issued an implementing Memorandum and created a Task Force.

- Endorsed by Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process (PAPP) Secretary Manuel T. Yan for action to DECS Secretary Ricardo Gloria and CHED Chairman Angel Alcala.
  - DECS Secretary Gloria and CHED Chairman Alcala issued implementing Memoranda.
- Adopted by the 4<sup>th</sup> National Peace and Order Summit as a strategy to eradicate the insurgency problem by addressing the its root causes.
  - Establish the framework for peace negotiations through its national implementation
  - Target number of responses Five Hundred Thousand (500,000)
- Endorsed for action of LGUs by DILG Secretary Robert Z. Barbers.
  - Two Million Four Hundred Thirty Nine Thousand One Hundred Four (2,439,104) or 487.82% of target number of responses were generated.

- The campaign was repackaged as YES FOR PEACE Bayanihan para sa Kapayapaan.
  - The questions were reformulated upon the suggestion of and in collaboration with the Office of the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process (OPAPP) with the guidance of PAPP Secretary Eduardo R. Ermita.
  - An inter-agency Memorandum of Undertaking for the national implementation of the campaign was entered into with OPAPP, DepEd, PhilPost, OPS-PIA, OPS-NPO, BSP, GSP and APO in December 2002.
    - Target number of responses Ten Million (10,000,000)
    - Services of participating institutions committed and delivered
    - Unfunded program
    - No time frame
  - PAPP Secretary Teresita Quintos Deles adopted an undocumented and unexplained hands-off policy and archived the MOU.
    - No replies to requests for consultation meetings were received from succeeding PAPPs
  - Reinvigorated in 2008 to underscore the need for people's participation in the comprehensive peace process after the rejection of the initialled BJE-MOA-AD between the government and the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF).
    - Several provisions were declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court.
  - The MILF Central Committee agreed to the YES FOR PEACE proposal for open (transparent) and participatory (participative) peace negotiations when it was presented to them in Camp Darapanan.
  - The MILF sent Mr. Al Camlian and Atty. Samuel Buat as representatives for the launching of the campaign by DepEd Secretary Jesli Lapus on 10 October 2008 at the Rizal High School.
  - Three Hundred Thirty Four Thousand Eight Hundred Seven (334,807) responses to the set of questions formulated with OPAPP in 2002 were generated.

- Revived and sustained by CHED and DepEd to push for transparency and to help mobilize people's participation in the comprehensive peace process.
  - CHED Chairperson Patricia B. Licuanan issued a series of Memorand urging the HEIs to participate in the campaign.
  - DepEd Secretary Bro Armin A Luistro and Undersecretaries Dina Ocampo, Albert Muyot and Mario Derequito issued a series of implementing Memoranda and advisories.
  - The Department of Education National Employees' Union (DepEd-NEU) provided secretariat support and office space and facilities for the campaign.

- All partner implementing and supporting institutions upheld the MOU and carried out their respective commitments stated therein.
- Repackaged as YES FOR PEACE Bayanihan para sa Kapayapaan, Kaunlaran at Kasaganahan.
  - Reformulated and reduced questions (from 10 to 3) to conform with PNoy's peace policy statements and further popularize the concept of Bayanihan or collective involvement and pro-active participation of the Filipino People in the peace process.

## **YES FOR PEACE ROCK**

The YES FOR PEACE Rock installed at the CSSP, UP Diliman in 1999 was "marked and unveiled" on 21 September 2015.





The simple event marked the declaration of all UP campuses a Zone of Peace, Freedom and Neutrality (ZOPFAN) by its Board of Regents during its 1056<sup>th</sup> Meeting.

## **EDSA 30**



11,236,918 responses symbolically turned over to President Aquino through PAPP Secretary Deles.

YES FOR PEACE described as the "Bagong Mukha ng People Power" by the EDSA People Power Commission.

Repackaged to YES FOR PEACE – BAYANIHAN NG BAYAN para sa Mapayapa, Maunlad at Masaganang Pilipinas pursuant to policy declarations made President Rodrigo R. Duterte.

Questions were reformulated to focus on the following concerns:

- Permanent cessation of the armed conflicts and the reallocation and/or realignment of resources to education, health, eradication of poverty, women empowerment, countryside development and other social services.
- Conduct of peace negotiations in the Philippines instead of abroad to facilitate the active involvement of all sectors of society as well as legislators.
- Amendment of constitutional provisions and laws that impede or block the implementation of peace agreements.
- People's participation in identifying local needs and integrated implementation of community-based peace and development programs.

- DepEd NEU National and Board of Trustees adopted campaign, requested DepEd Secretary to issue DepEd Memorandum for national implementation of the campaign.
- DepEd Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones issued DepEd Memorandum No. 066, s. 2017 re: YES FOR PEACE -BAYANIHAN NG BAYAN.



## Six-Point Peace and PILIPINAS Development Agenda\*

- Meaningful implementation of the FAB and CAB towards healing in the Bangsamoro
- 2. Completion of implementation of remaining commitments under the GPH-MNLF Peace Agreement for a just closure
- 3. Accelerated signing and implementation of the accords with communist insurgents
- 4. Immediate conclusion of the peace process with the CPLA and the RPMP-RPA-ABB
- 5. Peace promoting catch-up socio-economic development in conflict affected areas
- Building a culture of peace and conflict sensitivity
